

As per order no: - B2/340/2019 dated 22/07/2019 the anti-sexual harassment cell was constituted with following members

The committee received its first complaint on 20-08-2019 through Principal. It was by a girl student against some college students and outsiders. On enquiry it is found that the complaint is valid. So, the committee decided to hand over the complaint to police authorities.

The second complain was received on 26-08-2019. It was a harassment case by a girl against two boys on enquiry the students apologized and the girl withdrew the complained.

Third complained was by a girl against a classmate about sexual harassment. the case was serious and handed over to the police Four girl students complained about the same person and his friend their complaints were treated by a committee of college council Both students mentioned in complaints were suspended one was taken back after enquiry.

Due to the pandemic crisis, the committee was unable to operate effectively. When regular classes. Members visited each class once regular classes began in January 2021 to create awareness among students about the cell and its goals

The committee received its first complaint on 16/04/2021 through the Principal. It was given by a Ladies hostel inmate against a male hostel staff regarding his misbehaviour.

There were two committee meetings. Members of the committee contacted the complainant prior to the first meeting to get more details about the incident. The accused appeared before the committee at the second meeting and refuted the accusations.

The committee came to the judgement that although it was impossible to determine whether the accused's behaviour was purposeful or not, the girl was mentally affected by it. The complainant only wanted to warn the accused to refrain from engaging in similar behaviour in the future since she was not prepared for further police investigation

As a precaution, the committee advised the authorities to solely place female staff members in the ladies' hostel.

INTERNAL COMPLAINTS COMMITTEE (ICC) 2021-22

As per the University Grants Commission Notification Dated 2nd May 2016 and as per the University Grants Commission (Prevention, prohibition and redressal of sexual harassment of Women employees and Students in Higher Educational Institutions) Regulations 2015, all Higher Educational Institutions (HEI) has to constitute an Internal Complaints Committee (ICC).

The University Grants Commission (Prevention, prohibition and redressal of sexual harassment of Women employees and Students in Higher Educational Institutions) Regulations 2015 shall come into force on the date of Publication in the Official Gazette of India and that it shall apply to all Higher Educational Institutions in India.

The Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) should have the following composition as its members:

A Presiding Officer who should be a woman faculty member, nominated by the Executive authority, employed at a senior level, and an Associate Professor or Reader (in case of a College) 2 Faculty members, 2 Non-teaching Employees, 3 students, and one member from amongst Nongovernment organisations or associations.

At least one-half of the total members of the ICC shall be women.

The Term of Office of the members of the ICC shall be for a period of 3 years.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE ICC

- a. The Internal Complaints Committee shall provide assistance if an Employee or a student chooses to file a Complaint with the Police.
- b. Provide mechanisms of dispute, Redressal and Dialogue to anticipate and address issues through just and fair conciliation without undermining Complainant's rights, and minimize the need for purely punitive approaches that lead to further resentment, Alienation or Violence.
- c. Protect the safety of the Complainant by not divulging the person's identity, and provide the mandatory relief by way of sanctioned Leave or relaxation of attendance requirement or transfer to another Department or Supervisor as required during the pendency of the Complaint or also provide for the transfer of the Offender.
- d. Ensure Prohibition of retaliation or adverse action against a covered individual because the employee or the student is engaged in protected activity.

OBJECTIVES OF THE INTERNAL COMPLAINT CELL

- 1. To deal with cases and to develop a policy against Sexual harassments for girl students Women in Workplaces, and in Higher Educational Institutions.
- 2. To promote a social and psychological environment to raise awareness on sexual harassment in its various forms.
- 3. To create a secure physical and social environment to deter any act of sexual harassment.
- 4. Prevention of discrimination and sexual harassment against women, by promoting gender amity among students and employees.
- 5. Deal with cases of discrimination and sexual harassment against women in a time bound manner aiming at ensuring support services to the victimized and termination of the harassment.

WHAT CONSTITUTE SEXUAL HARASSMENT?

Sexual Harassment includes unwelcome sexual behavior of direct or implied nature such as

- Physical contact and advances
- Requests for sexual favours
- Sexually colored remarks
- Showing pornography
- Unwelcome physical, verbal or non-verbal sexual conduct

THE PROCESS FOR MAKING COMPLAINT AND CONDUCTING INQUIRY

The ICC shall comply with the procedure prescribed in these Regulations and the Act for making a Complaint and inquire into the Complaint in a time bound manner. The Higher Education Institution shall provide all necessary facilities to the ICC to conduct the inquiry expeditiously and with required privacy.

THE PROCESS OF MAKING COMPLAINT OF SEXUAL HARASSMENT

An aggrieved person is required to submit a written complaint to the ICC within 3 months from the date of the incident and in case of a series of incidents within a period of 3 months from the date of the last incident.

Provided that where such complaint cannot be made in writing, the Presiding Officer or any Member of the Internal Committee shall render all reasonable assistance to the person for making the complaint in writing.

Provided further that the ICC may, for the reasons to be accorded in the writing, extend the time limit not exceeding 3 months, if it is satisfied that the circumstances were such which prevented the person from filing a complaint within the said period.

Friends, Relative, Colleagues, Co-students, Psychologist, or any other associate of the victim may file the complaint in situations where the aggrieved person is unable to make a complaint on account of physical or mental in capacity or death.

PROCESS OF CONDUCTING ENQUIRY

- a. The ICC shall upon receipt of the complaint, send one copy of the complaint to the Respondent within a period of 7 days of such receipt.
- b. Upon receipt of the Copy of the Complaint, the respondent shall file his or her reply to the Complaint along with the list of documents, and names and addresses of witnesses within a period of 10 days.
- c. The enquiry has to be completed within a period of 90 days from the receipt of the Complaint. The Enquiry report with recommendations, if any has to be submitted within 10 days from the completion of the inquiry to the Executive authority of the HEI. Copy of the findings or recommendations shall also be served on both parties to the complaint.
- d. The Executive authority of the HEI shall act on the recommendations of the committee within a period of 30 days from the receipt of the inquiry report, unless an appeal against the findings is filed within that time by either party.
- e. An appeal against the findings or / recommendations of the ICC may be filed by either party before the Executive authority of the HEI within a period of 30 days from the date of the recommendations.
- f. If the Executive authority of the HEI decides not to act as per the recommendations of the ICC then it shall record written reasons for the same to be conveyed to the ICC and both the parties in the proceedings. If on the other hand it is decided to act as per the recommendations of the ICC, then a show cause notice answerable within 10 days shall be served on the party against whom the action is decided to be taken. The Executive authority of the HEI shall proceed only after considering the reply or hearing the aggrieved person.
- g. The aggrieved party may seek conciliation in order to settle the matter. No monetary settlement should be made as a basis of conciliation. The HEI shall felicitate a conciliation process through the ICC as the case may be, once it is sought. The resolution of the conflict to the full satisfaction of the aggrieved party wherever possible, is preferred purely punitive intervention.

h. The identities of the aggrieved party or victim or the witness of the offender shall not be made public or kept in the public domain especially during the process of the inquiry.

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

REBUILD KERALA Flood Relief and Rehabilitation Activities

Achievements through the activities

- > Nearly a lakhs worth materials were distributed to the beneficiaries during the flood time
- > Active support in the camp centres
- More than 100 houses were cleaned during the flood time
- ➤ Post flood survey in association 5 Grama panchayath of the district
- ➤ More than 600 houses were covered for flood relief survey

Work at relief camp centres

NSS volunteers were engaged in camp related activities day and night at their native flood relief camps. 18 volunteers were worked at 6 camps in the district. Kanjikkode Apn ghar, Kollangode, MES College, Alampllam, Pirayiri, Pattanchery, etc. are the major camps in which the volunteers were engaged.



Donation activity

NSS Units collected Rs. 10000/- in a day and with the help of other agencies of RS.60000/- purchased dress materials like purdha, night weares, kids weares and inner wares for the peoples of relief camps especially at Cooperative college and MES college were the main distribution camps. Since it was of highly demanded, It got great appreciation in the camp on the day. Nearly 360 people got the benefit of the programme.



Work at collection centres

Volunteers were engaged in the collection centres mainly at Taluk office, Collectorate and indoor stadium Palakkad. Unloading, loading, sorting, arrangement and distribution of articles to various camps were the major activities associated with collection centres. 26 Volunteers were worked in a shift mode alternatively morning and evening



House cleaning activity

House cleaning activity undertaken by NSS units at Andimadam, Puzhayoram colony. As the first stage of cleaning almost 12 houses were completed on the day. Since the houses were situated near the river, houses were dumbed with heay dirty mud and wastes. It has took hours of effort to remove the same. Under the leadership of programme officer K. Pradeesh and C. Jayanthi, 60 volunteers were participated on the day

The second stage cleaning started at Puzhayoram colony, Andimadam. 9 houses were cleaned on the day. Since the houses were situated near the river, houses were dumbed with heay dirty mud and wastes. Out of the 196 houses, 20 houses were cleaned by 130 volunteers under the leadership of NSS district coordinator K. Pradeesh. Since the housed were situated near 'Sanghuvarathode' Houses were filled by mud and wastes flown from the canal. It took 6 hours to complete the cleaning process on the day.



House cleaning activity

80 volunteers engaged in the house cleaning activity at the Kollankode, Alampallam, one of the flood affected area of the district. On the first day volunteers completed 10 houses. The alampallam V.P. Thara colony near gayathri river largely affected in the flood. Volunteers took hours of hard work to accomplish the cleaning activity.NSS programme officer K. 




12 DAYS TRAINING FOR WOMEN ON SELF DEFENSE



31.12.2022, Friday










Programme 4 - Workshop on Positive Mental Attitude








Programme 7 – SCHOOL VISIT





7.1.1 QlM: Measures initiated by the Institution for the promotion of gender equity during the last five years.



On the occasion of International Women's Day, the Philosophy Department of Chittur Govt College organized a talk on the topic, "Women's situation in Eastern and Western Society" by Dr. Maya S. from the Department of Philosophy, Kerala Varma College. The talk was held on March 8, 2022, in the college auditorium, and was attended by students, faculty members, and members of the public.

Dr. Maya began her talk by highlighting the historical and cultural differences between Eastern and Western societies in their treatment of women. She pointed out that in many Eastern societies, women have traditionally been relegated to subordinate roles, with limited access to education and employment opportunities. On the other hand, Western societies have made more progress in terms of gender equality, but still have a long way to go in addressing issues such as the gender pay gap and representation of women in leadership positions. Maya then went on to discuss some of the challenges that women face in both Eastern and Western societies. 


