7.2.1 – Implementation of Best Practices

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Government College Chittur Platinum Jubilee Celebrations Houseconstruction initiatives

The Platinum Jubilee (75th Anniversary) of Chittoor Government College was celebrated in a grand manner with a series of events till the month of August 2022. As part of the Platinum Jubilee celebrations, the social responsibility of building houses for the homeless students of the college was undertaken by the students, teachers, alumni and volunteers of the college. The students who applied for the said housing scheme were included in the priority list

As part of the Platinum Jubilee celebrations, it was decided to provide houses to the homeless students of the college. A specially prepared application was distributed to the children. A total of 14 applications were received from various departments with the recommendation of teachers. Pratish Kunchu, members of the Housing Committee, Dr. Murugan, Dr. Nisha Mol Mr. Ramabhadran, Dr. Manu Chakraborty and interviewed the children. The purpose of the interview was to inquire directly about the conditions at home of each one. The committee members then visited the homes of the students who had submitted their applications and saw the situation first hand. People who own at least 5 cents of land were selected for the housing project. The place should be in the name of the student or their parents. A priority list was prepared of the applications received using various criteria such as students whose parents have died, students whose parents are bed-ridden, and girlsonly families. People who are unlikely to get a house in the government's life scheme have been selected for this. Students having healthy parents engaged in various occupations, students having more than 8 cents of land, families with only sons are not considered for the above application. The committee recommended 7 deserving students. The teachers and other employees of the college set aside a portion of their salary for this purpose. All the students of the college contributed whatever amount they could towards it. In addition, the students were able to raise funds for the construction of houses through voluntary organizations, charitable trusts, businessmen from various sectors and the CSR fund of the Kerala State Beverages Corporation. 430 square feet houses are being built. A maximum of Rs 6 lakh has been earmarked for a house. The families who were prepared earlier by the Foundation for the construction of houses required a maximum of Rs 4.5 lakh to complete the houses. 5 houses were completely completed and two houses were partially completed. Handing over of keys to all houses is expected in June 2023. The Platinum Jubilee Committee members came up with the idea of finding a deserving person and providing them with a house every year.





EARN WHILE YOU LEARN PROGRAMME

Department of Botany, Government College Chittur, Palakkad Activity Report

The EARN WHILE YOU LEARN PROGRAMME for the academic year 2023-24 was structured as a comprehensive two-stage initiative aimed at providing students with hands-on experience and theoretical knowledge in mushroom cultivation and compost preparation. The first stage focused on creating awareness among participants by imparting principles and theoretical concepts related to mushroom cultivation and compost preparation. During this phase, students received limited hands-on training to reinforce their understanding. In the second stage of the program, participants had the opportunity to actively engage in each step of mushroom cultivation and compost preparation. This hands-on approach allowed students to gain practical experience in handling various aspects of cultivating mushrooms and preparation compost. Emphasizing sustainability, the training included the utilization of different biodegradable wastes, including agricultural by-products, in the composting process.

Dr. Sojan Jose, Assistant Professor in the Department of Botany at Govt. Victoria College, Palakkad, played a pivotal role in the program. On December 8, 2023. Dr. Jose conducted an informative session on mushroom cultivation, highlighting the nutritive value of mushrooms and their value-added products. His expertise enriched the students' understanding of the subject, providing them with valuable insights into the science and practice of mushroom cultivation. Further contributing to the program, Dr. Damodaran P N, Head of the Waste Management Division at IRTC, Mundur, Palakkad, delivered a talk on Zero Waste Management. Dr. Damodaran elaborated on the various stages of solid waste management, encompassing collection, processing, and the bioconversion of biodegradable solid waste into oyster mushrooms (Pleurotus pulmonarius or Pleurotus sajor-caju). Through a practical demonstration, he showcased the different stages of mushroom cultivation, adding a practical dimension to the theoretical knowledge imparted. This session was on 20th December 2023 FN. Abilash K, representing MANNU KERALA, led the training session on compost production on 20th December 2023 AN. In his session, Abilash provided insights into the dos and don'ts of the compost production process. This information was crucial for the students to grasp the intricacies of producing high-quality compost using various biodegradable materials. Dr. Sarika A R, Senior Scientist specializing in Microbiology, also actively participated in the

program. Her presence added depth to the students' learning experience, as she interacted with them, sharing her expertise and knowledge in the field of microbiology related to mushroom cultivation.

Their engagement in the training program showcased their enthusiasm and commitment to gaining practical knowledge in the field. The program's emphasis on utilizing biodegradable wastes for compost production aligns with contemporary environmental concerns and promotes a circular economy approach. Participants not only learned about the theoretical aspects of mushroom cultivation but also had the opportunity to apply their knowledge in real-world scenarios. This holistic learning

experience is expected to contribute to their academic and professional growth, preparing them for future challenges in the field of agriculture and waste management.

Reiniger- Sanitary Cleaner and Floor cleaner

The Earn While You Learn program initiated by the Chemistry Department aimed to provide students with practical skills and financial opportunities through hands-on experience in the production of sanitary cleaners. The program spanned a specific period, involving training sessions, practical workshops, and a structured approach to blend theoretical knowledge with real-world applications.

The Department of Chemistry, Government College Chittur, organized a one-day workshop on the production of a sanitary cleaner named "Reiniger" on 23/1/2024. Dr. Ambili K. U., Assistant Professor, Department of Chemistry is served as the Resource Person. The workshop is designed in two sessions and aimed to provide participants with hands-on experience in the synthesis and formulation of an effective and eco-friendly sanitary cleaner. The event included theoretical sessions on chemical principles, practical demonstrations, and discussions on the importance of maintaining cleanliness and hygiene.

The workshop began with a theoretical session on the chemistry of cleaning agents. Topics covered included the role of surfactants, solvents, and other active ingredients in formulating effective cleaners. Emphasis was placed on understanding the environmental impact of cleaning agents and the need for sustainable alternatives.

Participants engaged in a hands-on demonstration of the production process of "Reiniger." They learned about the selection and measurement of ingredients, mixing techniques, and quality control. Safety protocols and waste disposal methods were also discussed to ensure responsible manufacturing practices.

This workshop successfully combined theoretical knowledge with practical skills, empowering participants to contribute to the development of eco-friendly cleaning solutions. The "Reiniger" sanitary cleaner serves as an example of how chemistry can be applied for the betterment of public health and environmental sustainability.


WORLD WETLAND DAY CELEBRATION (2nd February 2023)

NSS Report 2022-23

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

Green Initiatives

Plastic free-Green campus

- The campus has been declared plastic-free.
- The use of plastic is strictly restricted in the campus.
- Students are advised to bring their lunch in steel boxes, which avoid accumulation of plastic carry bags in the campus.
- Separate waste baskets are used for bio-degradable and non-biodegradable materials.
- Reusable cups and plates are promoted inside the campus to reduce plastic usage.
- The non-biodegradable wastes are giving to Haritha karma sena of Chittur Thathamangalam Municipality.
- Paperless Office Communication among the teachers and office are through WhatsApp groups and e mails.
- Electronic forms are promoted to reduce the paper usage.
- Electronic display is placed in front of the principal office to display major activities of the colleges; it helps to minimize the use of flex boards.
- We have a public addressed system; most of the announcements are happened through this system.
- Students are asked to submit their copies of assignments in soft copy format.
- A good number of students rely on public transportation to reach campus. Only a small percentage of students use motor bikes for transportation.
- The whole pedestrian ways are interlocked for better water holding capacity, in an ecofriendly manner
- The roads are beautified with trees on both sides.

Waste management

- Dry –day observations has been conducting in first working day of every month
- E-waste management as per the directions of the Directorate of collegiate education department has been the part of the waste management practices of the committee
- Separate bins for different types of wastes are placed throughout the campus at important vantage points for proper collection and segregation of wastes.

- Vermicompost units are established in the campus for disposal of biodegradable wastes generated through garden trimming and vegetable wastes from the canteen and hostel mess.
- Biogas plants have been installed in the campus to convert the food waste generated into biogas.
- The college has taken initiatives to implement segregation of solid waste and hand over plastic waste for recycling and safe disposal instead of the unhealthy practice of burning it or dumping it in public places or water bodies.
- College has given special awareness programmes to laboratory safety measures and disposal of chemical waste in proper scientific way.
- College has installed incineration unit in the campus for hygiene and proper sanitation.
- The institution follows 'Green Protocol' while conducting seminars and other events .Students and faculty are encouraged to use steel glasses.
- The use of single use plastic is strictly banned within the campus. The college follows green protocol for all its official and public meetings seminars and conferences.
- College has established a plastic free zone around the campus
- Liquid waste management College encouraged the reuse of liquid solvents derived from laboratory and successfully implemented in the research as well as other laboratories.
