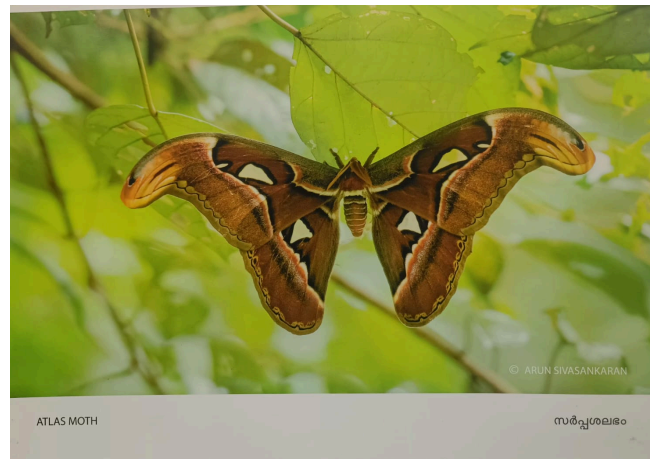




## Exhibition Highlights

The photographs depicted a wide variety of species, including butterflies, birds, insects, reptiles such as snakes, amphibians, and other wild animals, reflecting the richness and diversity of India's wildlife.



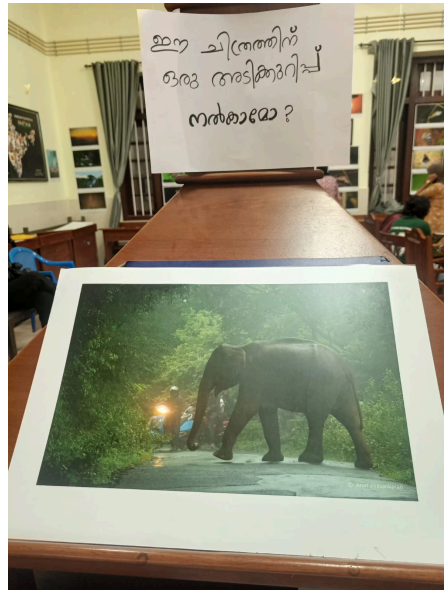

## Caption Writing Competition
